

## Five Timeless Truths About Kingdom Work

Colossians 1:16-18

16. For by him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him.

17. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together.

18. And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy.

Mat 9:35 - Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness.

Mk. 1:27 - The people were all so amazed that they asked each other, "What is this? A new teaching--and with authority! He even gives orders to evil spirits and they obey him."

1 John 3:8 - "The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the devil's work."

Acts 10:37-38 - You know what has happened throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached-- how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and how he went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil, because God was with him.

"yatsar" = to form or to fashion.

Rev 11:15 - "The kingdom of the world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of his Christ, and he will reign forever and ever."

Matt 11:12 - "From the days of John the Baptist until now, the kingdom of heaven has been forcefully advancing, and forceful men lay hold of it."

Luke 16:16 - "The Law and the Prophets were proclaimed until John. Since that time, the good news of the kingdom of God is being preached, and everyone is forcing his way into it."

Luke 13:24 - "Make every effort to enter through the narrow door, because many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able to.

### **1. If it's Kingdom work, it always starts with a promise!**

Psalms 127:1 - Unless the LORD builds the house, its builders labor in vain. Unless the LORD watches over the city, the watchmen stand guard in vain.

2 Corinthians 1:20 - For no matter how many promises God has made, they are "Yes" in Christ. And so through him the "Amen" is spoken by us to the glory of God.

### **2. If it's Kingdom work, it always requires patient endurance!**

Hebrews 6:12 - We do not want you to become lazy, but to imitate those who through faith and patience inherit what has been promised.

Psalms 105:18-19 - (Talking about Joseph) They bruised his feet with shackles, his neck was put in irons, till what he foretold came to pass, till the word of the LORD proved him true.

Patient endurance = When you want to quit... DON'T!!!

Gen. 40:23 - The chief cupbearer, however, did not remember Joseph; he forgot him.

Pastor Mike Mille' - "Pain and suffering is temporary, but quitting is permanent!"

### **3. If it's Kingdom work, it always involves praise!**

Psalms 8:1-2 - O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens. From the lips of children and infants you have ordained praise because of your enemies, to silence the foe and the avenger.

Ps. 22:3 - Yet you are enthroned as the Holy One; you are (sit on, live in, inhabit, to marry, become as one) the praise of Israel.

Joshua 6:20 - When the trumpets sounded, the people shouted, and at the sound of the trumpet, when the people gave a loud shout, the wall collapsed; so every man charged straight in, and they took the city.

Acts 16:25-26

25. About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them.

26. Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prison were shaken. At once all the prison doors flew open, and everybody's chains came loose.

Numbers 14:26-28

26. The LORD said to Moses and Aaron:

27. "How long will this wicked community grumble against me? I have heard the complaints of these grumbling Israelites.

28. So tell them, `As surely as I live, declares the LORD, I will do to you the very things I heard you say:

Phil. 2:14-16a

14 Do everything without grumbling or arguing,

15 so that you may become blameless and pure, "children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation." Then you will shine among them like stars in the sky

16 as you hold firmly to the word of life.

#### **4. If it's Kingdom work, it always includes supernatural provision!**

Matthew 6:33 - But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

II Corinthians 9:7 - Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

#### **5. If it's Kingdom work, it always involves humility!**

Luke 14:11 - For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Matthew 18:1-4

1. At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?"
2. He called a little child and had him stand among them.
3. And he said: "I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.
4. Therefore, whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

Phil. 2:3-11

3 Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves,

4 not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

5 In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

6 Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;

7 rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.

8 And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death— even death on a cross!

9 Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name,

10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

11 and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Lk. 17:20-21 - Once, having been asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, Jesus replied, "The kingdom of God does not come with your careful observation, nor will people say, 'Here it is,' or 'There it is,' because the kingdom of God is within you."
